







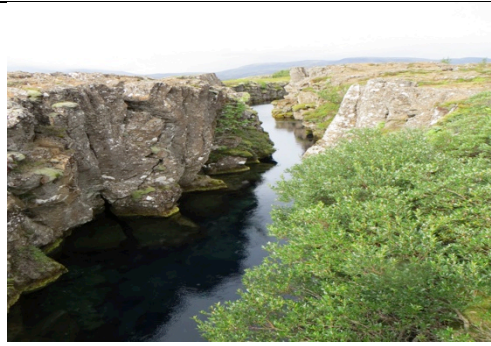

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ known as the sunlight zone</li> <li>▪ the top layer of the ocean</li> <li>▪ home to most marine life</li> <li>▪ is the warmest</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ known as the twilight zone</li> <li>▪ only some light enters this layer</li> <li>▪ colder than the sunlight zone</li> <li>▪ pressure increases</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ known as the midnight zone</li> <li>▪ this layer is dark and gets no light</li> <li>▪ creatures may have small eyes or no eyes</li> </ul>

Abyssopelagic Zone	Hadalpelagic Zone	coral reef
		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ know as the abyss</li> <li>▪ this layer is very black</li> <li>▪ here the ocean floor is covered with muddy material from organic waste</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ the deepest part of the ocean</li> <li>▪ area of canyons and trenches below the ocean floor level</li> <li>▪ pressure here is very great--over 8 tons per square inch.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ a ridge or rock-like structure made up of groups of small sea animals shaped like tubes</li> </ul>

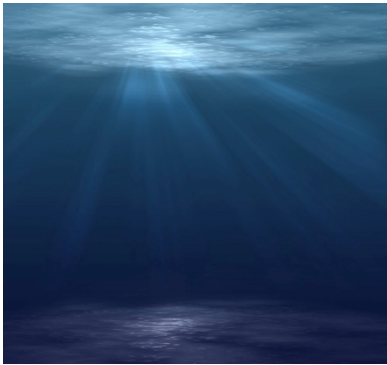


(adjective) relating to the sea and the creatures that live in the ocean
