


<p>The top layer of the ocean is home to most marine life and is the warmest. This is the layer with the most natural light.</p>	<p>Only some light enters the second ocean layer. It is colder than the sunlight zone and pressure increases.</p>	<p>The third ocean layer is dark and gets no light. Creatures in this layer have adaptations like small eyes...or no eyes at all!</p>

<p>The fourth layer is pitch black on the ocean floor. The ocean floor is covered with muddy material from organic waste.</p>	<p>This is the deepest layer of the ocean found in canyons and trenches. The pressure here is over 8 tons per square inch.</p>	<p>A ridge or group of rock-like structures made up of groups of small sea animals shaped like tubes.</p>

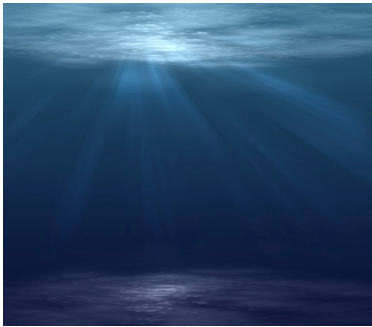
