1. What breed of dog did you research?

Siberian Husky

2. Where did this particular breed of dog originate from?

The Chukchi tribe in northern Siberia which is found in the northern territory of Russia

3. What is the history of this particular breed? What's the story behind it?

The Siberian Husky breed was developed by the Chukchi people of northeastern Asia, an ancient Siberian hunting people.

4. What is the main purpose of this particular breed? What was it bred to do? (Hunting? Protection? Finding food? Companionship? War? To retrieve? Be adorable?)

The Chukchi people bred these dogs to assist them hunting and to pull loads on sleds for long distances through the extremely cold and harsh environment of the Siberian Arctic. They were also used for hunting reindeer and companionship.

5. Is there something noticeable about this breed that allows it to fit into the climate of which it originated? Is there something about the size, shape, fur (coat), tail, eyes, etc. that makes it unique?

Siberian Huskies:

- Have a THICK DOUBLE COAT Fitting for the climate it was bred in.
- Weigh 40-60 pounds on average Necessary for the task of pulling sleds.
- Come in a variety of colors, but almost always mixed with white.
- Have long, furry tails which are used to provide additional warmth when sleeping outside which was common.
- 6. What are some of the behavioral traits of this particular breed?

Siberian Huskies:

- Are intelligent and independent: signs of a well-trained and bred dog.
- Are highly social: quick to make friends with complete strangers.
- Have high predatory instincts: can prey on smaller animals like squirrels and birds and can include cats. (However, some huskies have been known to live happily alongside a feline companion.)
- Are athletic and intelligent.
- Are not easily trained despite their relatively gentle demeanor and affectionate behavior.
