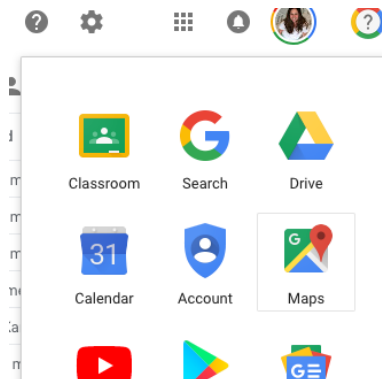


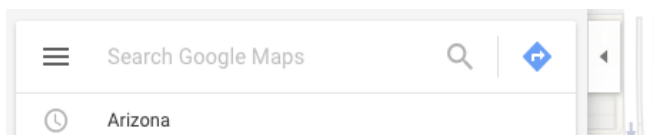
How to Create Your Own Memory Map in Google Maps

(inspired by Google Treks <http://googletreks.org/tutorial/index.htm>)

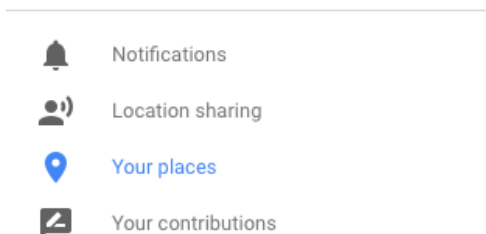
1. Once logged into Google, click on the **Maps** icon from the drop down menu.



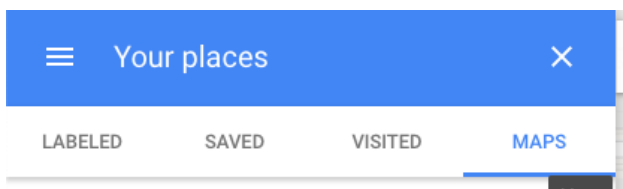
2. At the top left corner click on the **3 bars** for a menu.



3. Find **Your Places** and click on it.



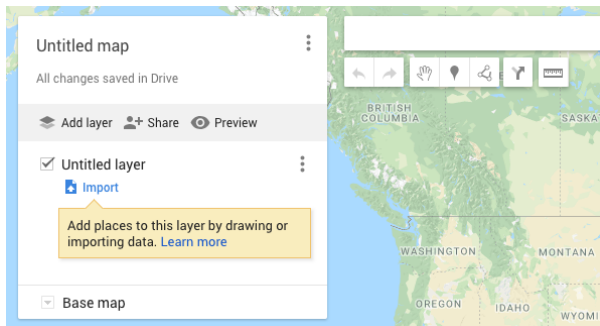
4. Click on **Maps**.



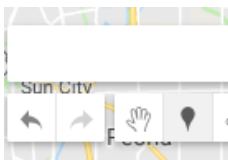
5. At the bottom of the screen, click on **Create Map**.



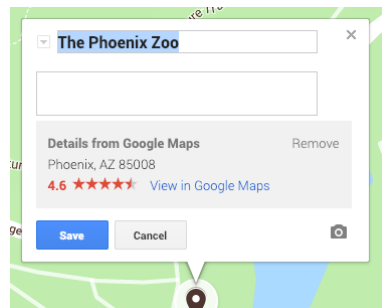
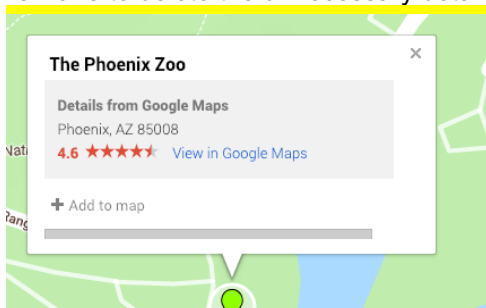
- Type a name on top of **Untitled map** and it will be automatically saved in the Google Drive. (Remember this assignment is about memories of yours. Your title might want to reflect this memory. Some examples are: Brad's Best Trip Ever, My Most Favorite Vacation, or Where I Have Lived.)



- To add places to your map, zoom into an area and click on the **Add Marker icon** (upside down raindrop) and then click on the spot you would like to drop the marker.

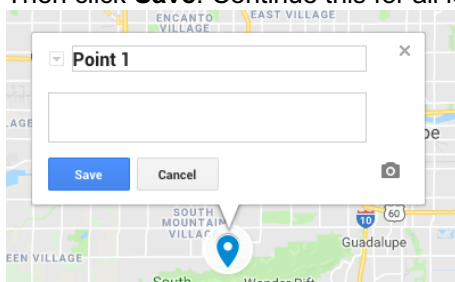


- Or type a name of a location in the search bar to add a place to your map. Then click on the **+ Add to map**. You can click on the **pencil icon** to change the information about the location and you can click **remove** to delete the unnecessary details.

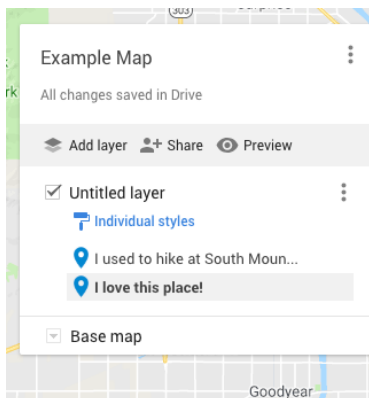


- In the smaller title area (**Point 1**) is where you want to type your first location. If you type inside the larger box, it will not be visible on the file that is printed. (Your paragraph should relate a memory of that place. Recall the time and describe the place.) (An example might be: May of 2018 Our tour of Alaska began in Anchorage where we got off the airplane and took a taxi to the hotel. Anchorage is not very big so we walked around the downtown area and got some dinner. It was fun to feel cold after leaving Arizona where it was so hot.)

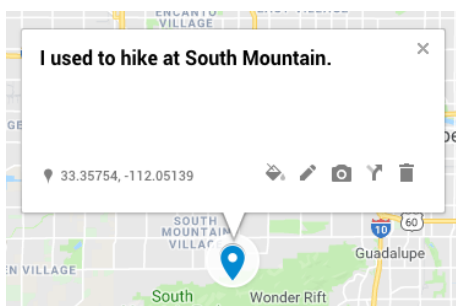
- Then click **Save**. Continue this for all locations.



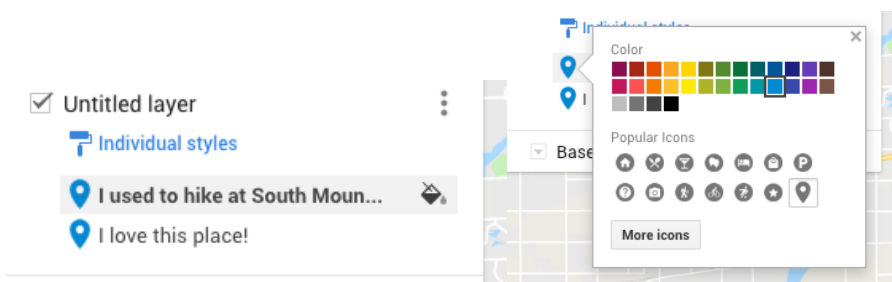
11. All the points of interest (your memories) will be in the **Untitled Layer** on the left side.



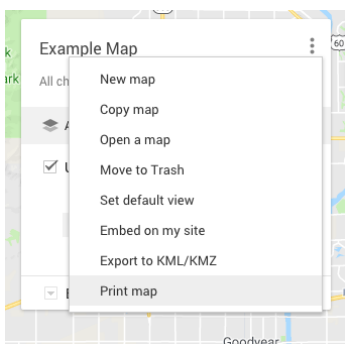
12. You can edit (change things) by clicking on the **Add Marker icon**, then the **pencil icon**. Then click **Save**. You can delete by clicking on the **trashcan icon**. Then click **Save**.



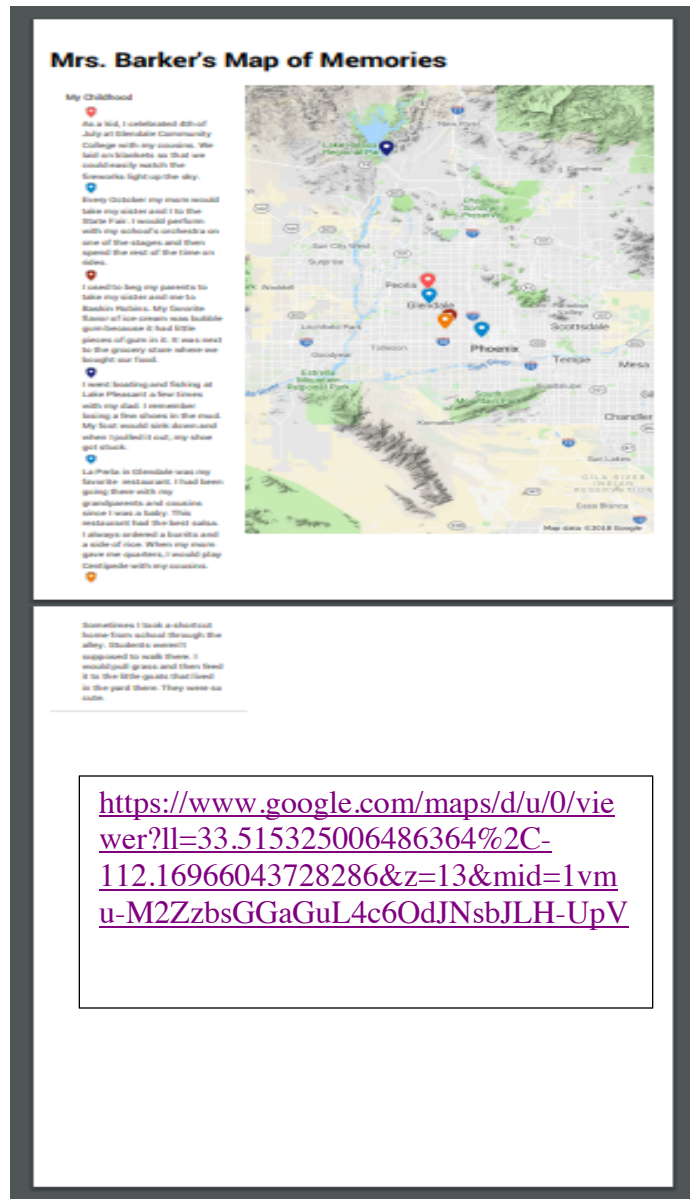
13. You can change the color of the Add Marker icon so that each marker has a different color. Hover over the description of the location until the **paint can icon** appears. You can click on a color or other icon.



14. When you are ready to print, click on the **3 dots** near the title of the map. Then choose **Print map**. Portrait and PDF options produce great results; however, you may change that.



15. You can **copy and paste** the web address to share with others. You can also share it from your Google Drive using the **Share icon**.
16. When it is time to display the printed maps, you might have to do some old-fashioned cutting and pasting to get it to your liking. Glue two pages together to make one long one, then cut off the extra at the bottom. Consider adding a photo of your interviewed subject or use construction paper as a backing or as a frame.
17. This is an example of the PDF and how it prints out. It uses 2 pages. Consider gluing the pages together and cutting off the extra to make a display.
18. There are more options to explore when you click on the **paint roller icon** below the Untitled Layer.
19. You can also change the map type by clicking on **Base map** under the location descriptions.
20. Remember to always click **Save**.
