

Explanation of TOADS Acronym

T = Title: What is the title (name) of the map?

O = Orientation: Helps you find north, south, east, and west on the map?
Does the map have a compass rose?

A = Author: Who made the map?

D = Date: What is the date of the map? When was it made?

S = Scale: Does the map have a scale marked? What is it? Remember, scale is how you can measure how far one place is from another.

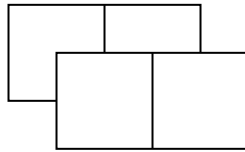
TOADS Student Dictionary Pages Directions

1. Fold (and cut) two regular 8 X 11 sheet of paper into half (hamburger fold)

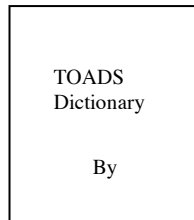
Fold on line, then cut.
