

Short History of Yuma

**Dates that are to the far left (and in bold) go with pictures for the timeline

Early Explorers

1540 - Spanish expeditions led by the Hernando de Alarcon and Melchior Diaz sailed up the Colorado. They found and noted the natural crossing of the Colorado River here in Yuma. The marked it as a strategic site for settlement and also wrote of the existing indigenous tribes now known as the Quechan and Cocopah.

1680s - Father Eusebio Kino traveled through Yuma while on an expedition to confirm that Baja California was a peninsula.

1774 - Juan Bautista de Anza was charged by Spain to find a route Sonora to northern California. He made a friendship with the Quechan natives to cross the Colorado River in Yuma. This made Yuma a location on maps of New Spain.

1779 – Father Francisco Garces founds the Catholic Mission near Yuma.

-1781 Quechan rebelled against Spanish and destroyed the Yuma Crossing

-1821 Mexico independence from Spain

-1846 Mexico and America break out in war

The American Era

1846 - Lt. Col. Phillip St. George Cook opens the Wagon Road to the West

1849- Gold Rush came right through Yuma. The quickest way to reach California was to cross the Colorado River in Yuma.

1850 – First rope ferry is built across the Colorado River in Yuma. 60,000 travelers crossed over in one year.

-1861 Civil War Breaks out

1864- Yuma Quartermaster Depot. U. S. Army was established to help protect all the supplies that were being transported up the river to different forts. The easiest way to



send supplies was by sea and up the Colorado River. Yuma at the time was considered a seaport.

1871- The city is named "Arizona City" soon to be renamed Yuma in 1873

1876 – Yuma Territorial Prison opens and is used until 1909

1877 – The Southern Pacific Railroad builds a bridge from Arizona to California making this a coast to coast railway. This allowed materials to be transported faster.

1909 – Marked the completion of the Laguna Dam on the River. This marked the start of being able to collect water more widely to use the land for faming.

1912- Yuma Siphon, a huge tunnel was dug which help lead the way for Yuma to become a huge area used for farming. The tunnel helped with canal irrigation.

1914 World War One

1915 first highway crossed the Colorado with Ocean-to-Ocean Bridge.

1939 World War Two

1943 – Yuma Proving Grounds is established as a testing ground and training center for the Army's weapons and machines.

1945 War Ended

1959 –Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) is created by the Marines to train pilots and test planes.
