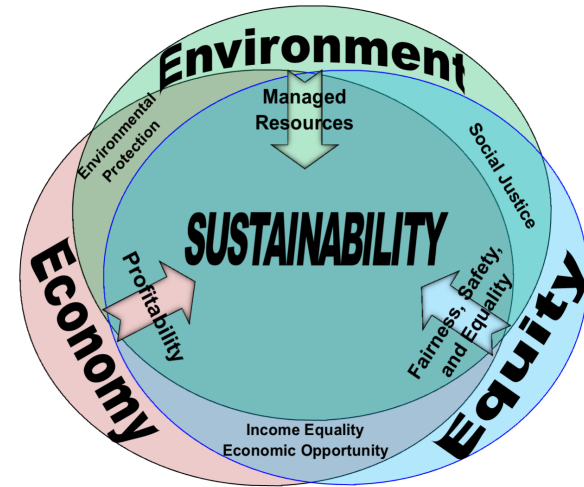


**sustainability:** broadly defined as the balance between economic, environmental, and social factors preserving and producing the long-term ability of a system to reproduce or replenish itself (Campbell, 1996)



**environment:** all living and non-living things occurring not because of humans

**social justice:** the view that everyone deserves equal economic, political, and social rights and opportunities.

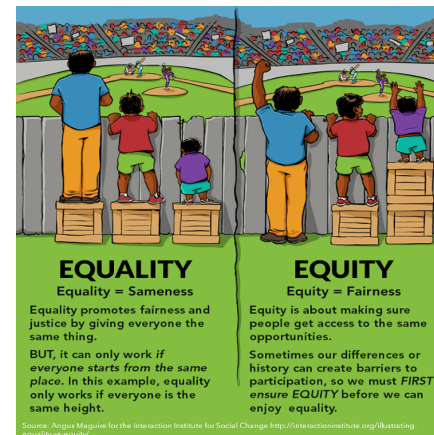
