Organization:

- 5. Article has an introduction, a conclusion and detailed ideas.
- 3. Article has an introduction or conclusion and some detailed ideas.
- 1. Has no introduction or conclusion and few details.

Ideas:

- <u>5</u>. Ideas are <u>mostly</u> clear and accurate.
- 3. Some ideas are not clear or accurate.
- 1. Ideas are unclear and inaccurate.

Conventions:

- <u>5</u>. Spelling, capitalization, and punctuation are <u>mostly</u> correct.
- <u>3</u>. Spelling, capitalization, and punctuation errors do not interfere with meaning.
- <u>1</u>. Errors in spelling, capitalization and punctuation make it impossible to understand the article.

Content:

- <u>5</u>. Includes 3 or more modifications and/or benefits.
- <u>3</u>. Includes 2 or more modifications and/or benefits.
- 1. Includes 1 or more modifications and/or benefits.
