5 Themes of Geography

Location

Answers the Question: Where is it?

Absolute Location

To pinpoint an exact position on Earth

Uses a grid system

Ex: Street Address, Alpha-Numeric, Latitude & Longitude

Relative Location

Gives a general sense of position on Earth in relation to another position

Descriptive phrases

Ex: Phoenix is located in south-central Arizona, 100 miles

North of Tucson

Place

Answers the Question: What is it like there?

The special character of a place that makes it unique

Physical Characteristics

Unique natural features; Due to "mother nature" Ex: Climate, Landforms, Bodies of Water, Elevation, Vegetation, Wildlife

Human Characteristics

Unique cultural features; Due to human beings

Ex: Language, Foods, Cultural Landmarks, Religions, Clothing,

Traditions

Human Environment Interaction

Answers the Question: What is the relationship between humans and their environment?

Humans Depend on their Environment

Survival Needs

Ex: Water, Oxygen, Food, Shelter, Warmth

Humans Modify their Environment + The Environment Modifies Humans

Modify means "to change" / Change can be positive or negative

Ex: Pollution, Deforestation, Irrigation, Mining, Agriculture, Cities, Ozone Hole, Global Warming, Natural disasters, drought, hurricanes

Humans Adapt to their Environment

All the ways humans protect themselves from the environment

Ex: Protective clothing, Protective shelter, Use of natural resources, Medicines, Emergency Evacuation Plans

Movement

Answers the Question: What is the connection between people and places?

Movement of People

Migration, Immigration, Refugees, Vacations, Job Relocations, Transportation, Commuters, Urbanization

Movement of Goods

Trade: Imports & Exports, Smuggling, Drug Cartels, International Shipping Routes, Interstate Trucking Routes, Outsourcing, Maquiladoras

Movement of Ideas

Fads, Books, Magazines, Newspapers, Television, Radio, Internet & Hi-Tech Communications

**Cultural Diffusion

Borrowing of foods, customs, holidays, religions, languages, etc. from one culture to another

Regions

Answers the Question: How can an area be defined by similar or unifying characteristics?

Political Regions

Areas that share similar <u>governments</u> or <u>treaty alliances</u> Cities, Counties, States, Provinces, Countries, Territories, Trade Alliances, Free Trade Zones

Physical Regions

Areas that share similar <u>physical</u> (natural) features Bodies of water: rivers, lakes, oceans, Climate, Ecosystems, Wildlife, Landforms: mountains, deserts, plains, plateaus

Cultural Regions

Areas that share similar <u>cultural</u> (human) characteristics Languages, Religions, History, Ancestry, Customs, Traditions, Land Use, Occupations
